- Adjusting/Creating domain: objects
- sometimes need to touch corresponding inetnum:

Lesson Learned

- `changed`: doesn't mean what one thought (or it ought?) to mean
- `inetnum`: updated **without** `changed`: `changed`
- This is well documented, though:

The information in this attribute [...] is not reliable as a full audit trail. [...] It is used as a reference for the benefit of the maintainer of the object. It is not intended to give any reliable information to a user who queries for an object.

Common changed: Uses

- Only one changed: attribute is mandatory
- Maybe creation timestamp?
- Maybe creation and last modification timestamp?
- Maybe full change history?
- Maybe completely random selection of changes?
- Especially not reliable w.r.t. latest change!
- Automated support for date part is available

What is Useful?

- Confidence in data accuracy? (see DP TF)
- Confidence in up-to-dateness?
- Isn't changed: really meta data?
- Would it apply to all attributes in an object?

Random Ideas

- changed: should change
- ... but not for NOOPs
- Should leave room for synchronizing bulk updates
- Maybe add additional automated attribute?
- ... but then what about the NOOPs?
- ... unless you only want to re-assure accuracy?
- Maybe just maintain creation and last modification dates?
